ASHP Recommends Greater Clarity and Consistency in FDA Communications on REMS

10/7/2015

The Food and Drug Administration (FDA) could alleviate some of the communications challenges associated with REMS through targeted outreach to healthcare providers, ASHP told an agency panel yesterday.

ASHP spoke at a hearing called by the FDA in an attempt to understand the impact of the use of REMS on the healthcare system and to identify improved approaches for minimizing their burden on patients and providers.

ASHP encouraged FDA officials to work toward a centralized electronic means for all REMS, including registration, provider education, and patient documentation requirements. Four Cosponsors Needed to Push Provider Status Legislation to Next Phase

Provider status legislation in the U.S. House of Representatives, the Pharmacy and Medically Underserved Areas Enhancement Act (H.R. 592), needs just four additional cosponsors to trigger the next step of the legislative process.

Rep. Fred Upton, Chair of the House Energy and Commerce Committee, has indicated that he would like the bill to have at least 230 cosponsors before he would hold a hearing. A new wave of support last week brought the legislation's cosponsors to 226. Time is of the essence to garner additional support, as there is less than a month left in the first part of this congressional session and representatives will soon be debating extending the debt ceiling.

More than 22,000 pharmacists, residents, pharmacy students, and industry representatives from the U.S. and 45 other countries took advantage of the wide range of educational sessions, special events, and networking opportunities offered December 6-10 at ASHP's 50th Midyear Clinical Meeting and Exhibition in New Orleans.

The meeting kicked off with a capacity crowd at the Opening General Session, which featured a special video celebrating the history of the Midyear; a tribute to ASHP CEO Emeritus Joseph A. Oddis, Sc.D.; and ASHP awards. The session also featured keynote speakers former President George W. Bush and former First Lady Laura Bush. The pair's daughter, Jenna Bush Hager, served as a surprise moderator for the keynote.

Sessions such as "Individualizing Therapy for Patients with Type 2 Diabetes," "Antimicrobial Stewardship in the Emergency Department," and "Safety and Quality Pearls 2015" proved extremely popular. More than 2,500 pharmacists, residents, and student pharmacists presented posters, and the Exhibit Hall featured more than 350 industry representatives. Thousands of attendees also took advantage of ASHP's popular Residency Showcase and Personnel Placement Service.



The Spotlight on Science session featured D. Tyler McQuade, Ph.D., program manager with the Defense Advanced Research Projects Agency (DARPA); John J. Lewin, III, Pharm.D., M.B.A., FCCM, FNCS, FASHP, division director of critical care and surgery pharmacy at The Johns Hopkins Hospital, Baltimore; and Klavs Jensen, Ph.D., head of the Department of Chemical Engineering, Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge. The trio spoke about innovative new technologies that will enable miniaturized and mobile drug manufacture Next December, the Midyear Clinical Meeting heads to Las Vegas.


Frank J. Nice, RPh, DPA, CPHP

Board Member: Dipti Kalra


